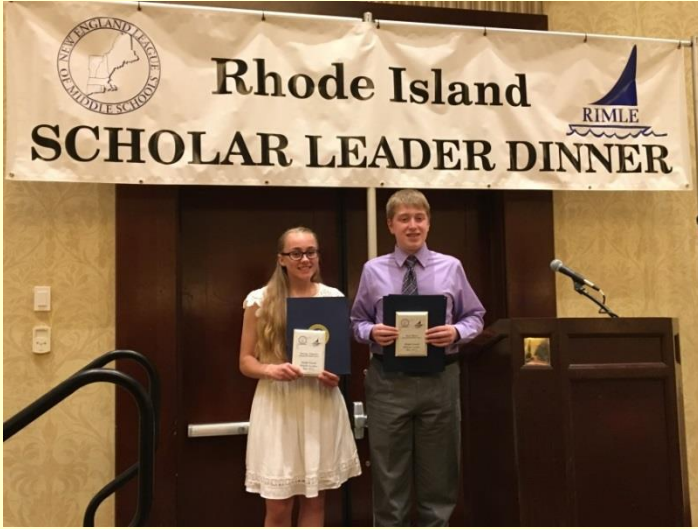


Our Band and Chorus students impressed audiences during their Spring Concerts! Awesome job, Mustangs!
